Accomplishments beyond the established goals set in 2013:

1. Baptist Easley partnered with Samaritan Health Clinic, the Dream Center, and Blue Cross Blue Shield to open and operate a free dental clinic in 2015 for indigent patients. This allows those patients to receive appropriate dental care and tooth extraction rather than having to be seen in the emergency room for pain issues related to tooth abscess.
2. Baptist Easley also instituted a Healthy Outcomes program to assist indigent clients with access to care, including medical homes. This patient benefit has provided numerous positive outcomes to include; access to medical homes, improved outcomes with acute and chronic health issues, and a connection to healthcare workers providing guidance and support with compassion.
In 2015 Baptist Easley partnered with Greenville Health System (Oconee Memorial Campus) to provide the Access Health Program which will enhance the current Healthy Outcomes Program. Access Health adds the benefit of managing care between multiple health agencies. This will allow for tracking of patient care, improved continuity of care and decrease overlap of services.
3. In 2014 Baptist Easley also placed Financial Assistance Representatives in Patient Registration to provide indigent clients with financial counseling services and referrals to local community partners. This added patient benefit allows for individuals to be treated with dignity while ensuring they receive holistic care in multiple aspects of their lives.
